^aIn the context of the ceasefire agreement reached between Israel and Hamas on 21 November 2012, the Israeli army announced an easing of the access restrictions along Gaza's perimeter fence. While following it some farmers resumed the cultivation of land located up to 100 metres from the fence, shooting incidents continued affecting civilians in areas as far as 1000/1500 metres from the fence.
